

AWARDS

1. Only one first place award ribbon, one second place award ribbon or one third place award ribbon may be awarded to each cultivar in any given section. As many honorable mention ribbons as quality merits may be awarded. In the Seedling Division, only first place ribbons are awarded, if merited.
2. The AIS Silver Medal and Certificate will be given to the person winning the most blue ribbons in the Horticulture Division.
3. The AIS Bronze Medal and Certificate will be given to the person placing second in winning the most blue ribbons in the Horticulture Division.
4. The AIS Best of Section Rosette will be given to the best blue ribbon cultivar providing the section qualifies.
5. The AIS Rosette and Certificate will be given for the Best Specimen of Show.
6. The AIS Rosette and Certificate will be given for the Best Seedling of Show. This seedling automatically receives an Exhibition Certificate (EC). Any other seedling receiving five(5) or more votes from AIS accredited judges in any show will also receive an EC.
7. In Division III – Youth, Silver and Bronze Medal and Certificates for Best Specimen of Show will be awarded in the same manner as Division I, providing the Division qualifies.
8. In Division IV – Artistic Design, the AIS Rosette will be given for the Best Design of Show, Best Design of Show – Youth and the Artistic Design Sweepstakes for adult and youth.

At the show, the Queen's Table will consist of the Best Specimen of Show, Best Seedling of Show, Best Design of Show, Best Specimen of Show – Youth, Best Design of Show – Youth, Best Seedling of Show – Youth, the best blue ribbon specimen of each applicable Division I Section A through U less Sections Q and T and the Best Show Flower(s) if available.

SHOW RULES

1. Any iris grower is eligible to exhibit. You need not be a member.
2. The show is being held under the auspices of The American Iris Society. Official rules and regulations of The American Iris Society cannot be violated.
3. The Greater Portland Iris Society and the show location assume no responsibility for any loss or damage to persons or property.
4. Standard award ribbons may be given: Blue, red, white and pink, with no more than one to each cultivar. This is a cultivar show in which each variety is a separate class.
5. The show committee reserves the right to remove any entry that becomes unsightly.
6. Exhibits must be correctly named by the exhibitor. Unlabeled or mislabeled irises will be disqualified.
7. Entries will be received at the show from 8:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. on the show day. Judging at 10:00 a.m.
8. Entries may not be removed prior to close of show except by direction of the Show Chairman.
9. Horticulture and Artistic judging will be done by accredited judges and all rulings by judges will be final.
10. In Divisions I and III, each exhibitor is limited to one entry of any named variety.
11. All entries in Horticultural must be grown and entered in person by the exhibitor.
12. Containers for the Horticultural Division will be supplied by the Greater Portland Iris Society
13. No iris bloom stalks or pollen are to be sold or taken from the premises by anyone unless the exhibitor directs them to be sold or taken.
14. Sections K, Q, S, T, U, and Seedlings are not eligible for the Best Specimen of Show award.
15. An AIS Judge may enter for awards but shall not judge sections in which he/she has entries.
16. Sections may be combined for fewer entries, or subdivided for excessive entries, as necessary, at the direction of the Show Chairman.

Exhibits in Division IV-Design exhibits will be judged using the *Scale of Points Artistic Design* as outlined in the current edition of the American Iris Society's *Handbook for Judges and Show Officials*.

DIVISION II – SEEDLINGS

Must be named or numbered and placed under applicable Sections A through O & R, as in Division I.

DIVISION III – YOUTH

Placed under applicable Section A through U, as in Division I. Youth exhibitors may enter Division I OR Division III, but may not enter the same variety in both.

SPECIAL RULES – HORTICULTURE DIVISION

This is a Cultivar show, staged according to type and in alphabetical order within the various sections and groups. Each variety constitutes a separate class and must be correctly named. No unnamed variety may be exhibited except seedlings which may be entered under number.

Division, Section, Group Identification, Exhibitor's Name and named variety (name or number in seedling division) must appear in both portions on the entry card. The entry card must be prepared by the exhibitor.

An exhibitor may enter a seedling originated or grown by another person, but the hybridizer's name and seedling name or number must appear on the entry card.

Exhibitors may enter **only one stalk of a variety** in single specimen or seedling sections but may enter any number of varieties.

All entries will be placed on the show bench by the Placement Committee.

Containers for the Horticulture Division (except for collections or container grown entries) will be supplied by the Greater Portland Iris Society. Containers appropriate for exhibit must be furnished by the exhibitor of collections and container grown entries.

Unobtrusive material may be used for bracing stalks at the neck of the container.

Unnamed stalks (except seedlings), potted entries (except for entries in the container section) or labeled iris grown by another person **are not eligible** for AIS ribbons or awards but may be displayed on a table marked **"FOR**

DISPLAY ONLY".

Sections may be combined for fewer entries, or subdivided for excessive entries, as necessary, at the direction of the Show Chairman.

Standard AIS award ribbons may be given: blue, red, white and pink, with no more than one to each cultivar.

An English Box (provided by the exhibitor) will consist of at least 5 OR no more than 6 individual flowers of the same classification of iris. Flowers may all be different cultivars or all of the same variety. Each blossom must be correctly named and labeled. A 3" x 5" card with the names of the iris in the correct position must be prepared and mounted outside the box by the exhibitor. Reservations are required, contact the Show Chairman.

Sections or groups for bulbous iris, collections, container grown iris, single blossom entries and English Boxes, **are eligible** to receive AIS award ribbons, special section ribbons and section rosettes. Award ribbons are included in the tally for Silver and Bronze Medals/Certificates but these entries **are not eligible** for the Best Specimen of Show Award.

DIVISION IV – ARTISTIC 2022 ARTISTIC SHOW THEME "GARDEN BEAUTY"

LET FREEDOM RING: Use red, white and blue. No flags allowed.

MEMORIES: Use an antique iris OR an antique container or both. If using antique iris, provide name.

THE SKY IS THE LIMIT: Mid-Season Show use "Haunted Heart", TB, or "Burgundy Fireworks", SIB, OR similar colored iris, Early Show and Late Show – designer's choice.

BEAUTY AND THE BEAST: Late Show use "Remembering Vic", SPU, OR similar colored iris. Early Show and Mid-Season Show – designer's choice.

SUPERCALIFRAGILISTICEXPEALIDIOUS: Early Show use "Lakota", IB, or any multi-colored iris, Mid-Season Show and Late Show – use an iris with more than one color.

If a show flower is not available, a similar iris may be substituted, knowing a design using the Show flower will receive more recognition.

Advanced reservations are required. Contact Kay Ludi, 503-668-9230, kludi@juno.com, at least one week prior to show date stating your entries.

Design exhibits will be judged using the *Scale of Points Artistic Design* as outlined in the current edition of the American Iris Society's *Handbook for Judges and Show Officials*.

An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class but may enter as many classes as desired.

Exhibitors must provide their own containers. No valuable treasures.

One or more iris bloom(s) must be used in each design and must be dominant flower in the design. The use of iris foliage in a design is the choice of the exhibitor. A small card naming the iris variety used in the design is encouraged.

The design must be made by the exhibitor, but plant material used in the design does not have to be grown by the exhibitor.

Fresh plant material should predominate and may not be treated in any manner. A minimum of dried and/or weathered plant material is permitted. Treatment of dried material is permitted.

The use of any part(s) of plants on the Oregon State or Washington State conservation list is strictly prohibited. The use of the American flag or any international flag is prohibited.

Backgrounds, accessories and special lighting are permitted. Artificial flowers and plant material, living members of the animal kingdom, landscapes and scenes, fruit or vegetables are not permitted.

Youth may enter designs in any class but must state their age.
